Dear Parents/Guardians,

Welcome to Term 2.

Opportunities:

We are fortunate in the range of learning opportunities that are available for our students.

This week we have had a range of activities going on for our young people:

- Two Year 9 Geography classes were conducting field work at Mt Buller, in the midst of the snow and the mist, and fully engaging with the learning opportunities there. Thanks particularly to Ms Brocklesby for organising the excursion.
- The Year 9/10 Sports Leadership class were in Melbourne attending a Melbourne Storm training session, they also visited an Islamic Museum and had lunch with Bachar Houli, former AFL player, learning about leadership in sport and the community.
- Year 9 students began their Morrisby careers profiling. Based on the initial testing, which was conducted this week, we will welcome careers advisors later this term to come and work with students 1:1.
- We held our school assembly this week where we celebrated students' academic
 achievements in numeracy, VCE Vocational Major, Indonesian and the School for
 Student Leadership. We also heard from the newly formed band 'Blue Curtain' watch
 out for them at upcoming functions across the Mansfield community.
- The Outdoor and Environmental Studies classes were at Mt Buller learning Mountain Bike skills and looking at the way people interact with the alpine context.
- Year 7 Pursuits classes went to Bonnie Doon to learn about the history of the area.

For the 11am service at the Mansfield Memorial Gates, our School Captains had the responsibility of reading several sections of the proceedings, and for laying a wreath. Important Information

Please ensure you read the following friendly reminders as we start Term 2.

MOBILE PHONES

Students are to leave Mobile Phones in their locker throughout the ENTIRE day. Messages can be left by calling the School on 5775 2022. Phones **cannot** be used for canteen purchases, we will only accept a physical card.

MESSAGES TO STUDENTS/STUDENTS LEAVING EARLY/USE OF PA

To reduce classroom disruptions, we will only be using the PA to call students to the Office during recess and lunchtime. If your child has an appointment or you are collecting them early during a school day, please either:

- give them a note to hand to their teacher
- leave a voicemail or speak to the Office team ahead of collection time so we have time to advise the student
- send a note through Compass ahead of time

LEAVING THE SCHOOL GROUNDS

Year 7-11 students who need to leave school grounds during the day must meet a parent/guardian at the School Office to be signed out. Alternatively, parents must call the Office to discuss or email mansfield.sc@education.vic.gov.au

UNIFORM & UNIFORM SHOP

Full uniform is expected of all students. If students require a 'uniform pass', they must see their Year Level Coordinator at the beginning of the day. The Uniform Shop is open every Wednesday at lunchtime (12.40pm – 1.30pm). Orders can be placed via the MSC website and families will be notified by email when ready to collect.

LOCKERS

ALL Students (Years 7 - 12) must have a lock for their locker. These can be brought from home (spare keys left at the School Office for safekeeping), or combination locks are available to buy from the School Office for \$15.

SICK BAY

Students not feeling well are to go to the Sick Bay which is located next to the library. Parents will be contacted by the First Aid staff when required. Students are not to call parents directly.

LOST PROPERTY

MEDIA CONSENT




