#### Benalla-Mansfield-Wangaratta Network Day:

On Thursday last week we hosted 20 principals and senior school staff for the Benalla, Mansfield, Wangaratta network day. As part of the day, they had the opportunity to be involved in a classroom 'learning walk'. Most of our network staff are primary school based, so it was a great opportunity for them to see secondary classrooms and speak to secondary aged students. The visitors spoke about our calm and orderly classrooms, the different learning activities occurring, the skills of our teaching team, the depth of knowledge particularly of our senior students, and the beautiful learning environments we have. It was a great showcase of our students and our school.

#### **Mt Buller Annex**

It's been a great start to the 2023 season up here at the Mt Buller Annex. The first few weeks of term were blessed with great snow conditions and many bluebird days with our students making the most of the conditions.

Last week we were visited by BioLAB who ran classes both in the classroom and on the snow for three days. BioLAB are one of the State government's Maths/Science centres and their particular focus is on sport and human performance. This is the eighth year BioLAB have travelled from Belmont to join us up on Buller and their visits are always one of the highlights of the season.

This year the group looked at three main areas. We examined the use of technology in sport and how the primary data we could drag out of human performance could be used to create graphs and tables and in turn inform coaching and improve performance. Each student was rigged up with high end GPS units and heart rate monitors before their sessions for two consecutive days. Data generated from these units was used to build booklets where students could represent it in various ways and make conclusions around their performances.

We studied materials technology and devised an experiment to test various materials used to make socks for Alpine environments. Students used hot water bottles, thermal imaging cameras and temperature probes to test their hypotheses in the snow.

Finally we looked at arousal and its effect on performance. We booked the sports hall and used a class set of 'Fitlights' to test student's reaction times at baseline, with increased heart rates and while in a more relaxed state. All results were logged and worked on in another custom designed booklet.

Needless to say it was an incredibly enjoyable and educational three days. All up the students were exposed to over \$60k dollars worth of equipment in the three days in some thoroughly engaging lessons.

A huge thank you to BioLAB for their ongoing commitment to the Annex. Can't wait to see what you come up with next year.

#### Year 11 2024 Course Counselling

All students commencing Year 11 in 2024 will enrol in a program to complete their Victorian Certificate of Education (VCE) with the option of pursuing their VCE with a Vocational Major (VM). For students who are not yet ready to complete their VCE, the Victorian Pathways Certificate (VPC) will enable students to continue building their literacy, numeracy, academic and vocational skills.

To support our current Year 10 students in selecting their senior school pathway, we are conducting face-to-face interviews to discuss 2024 subject selections and pathways. Each student and their family will have 30 minutes allocated to their appointment with a member of MSC staff to discuss senior school pathways, subject selections, subject information, and program requirements. Bookings will be made online and information regarding how to book these appointments will be provided over the coming two weeks.

All parents are encouraged to attend the College on Wednesday 9th August at their elected appointment time with their child to discuss 2024 subject selections. Students will attend classes as per the normal timetable on the day and will be released from class during their appointment time.
