From The Principal

Dear Parents/Guardians,

Parent Teacher Student Interviews (PTS):

This Thursday we are conducting our PTS interviews for Years 7-10 which follow on from the publication of the Progress Reports on Compass.



I encourage you to bring your child to these interviews and let them be a part of the conversation. Teachers will usually lead a series of reflective questions to help students understand their learning progress and what their 'next steps' are. Here are four questions you might like to ask the teachers:

- What is my child learning?
- How are they going?
- How can they improve?
- What supports can I provide at home?

Enjoy the conversation!

Victorian Certificate of Education (VCE) & Vocational Major (VCE VM):

Students in Year 12 are well into the process of completing their studies for the year. Most of their courses conclude this week, with time in the first three weeks of Term 4 for revision, exam preparation and course completion.

During the term break, trial exams for VCE students are run with an external examiner, using the same conditions that students will experience for the end of year exams. It is their best opportunity to practice those important exam skills, as well as providing an opportunity to tidy up any misconceptions still remaining about the course work. Practice makes perfect!

For parents of students taking the exams, these holidays are a critical time for supporting and encouraging your young person. You may well find that students are a bit 'tetchy' during this time. Just rely on those reserves of patience, and work with your young person to structure and plan their time. My suggestion is some time of recreation and some time of study. Students in Year 12 should absolutely be working on their revision for a significant part of the term break.

Mt Buller Annex:

During the winter term we have again had a selection of students enrolled in the Mt Buller Annex program. We enable classroom lessons to occur in the afternoons, that complement the on-snow training of these aspiring athletes in the morning.

Students have been tracking their learning journey throughout the term which culminates in a presentation of their work this week at the Presentation Night. Well done to Sam Magree, teacher at the Annex. We look forward to welcoming these students back in Term 4.

Poetry Slam:

Ms Wale organised a Poetry Slam Performance by spoken word performer, Megan Riedl, on Tuesday for Year 9 students. With the curriculum currently focusing on poetry and creative writing, it was a great opportunity. R U OK? Day

September 14 this year is R U OK? Day in Australia. This day started in 2009 and encourages people to have conversations with friends, family, colleagues, associates, or strangers to check in and to offer support. By asking 'Are you OK?', doesn't mean you need to be able to solve another person's problem, but shows that you care, that you are willing to listen and to help that person to get the help that they need. For young people, support can mean helping friends to speak to a trusted adult, a counsellor or one of the services listed below. The final step in this process is following up/ checking in again.

4 out of 10 people choose not to ask R U OK? because they don't think they are qualified to have an important conversation. This year's theme is "I'm here to hear", which reinforces that you don't need qualifications to talk with someone about mental health. A conversation really can change a life.

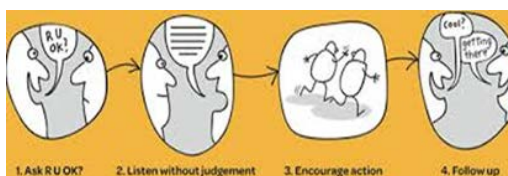

Mt Buller Annex

Even though Mother Nature hasn't played her part this year, spirits are still high up here at the Mansfield Secondary College Mt Buller Annex. As the season draws to a close, students are furiously completing their work but have still had time to pause and reflect on what has been a very successful season for many.

Our students competed valiantly in this year's Victorian Interschools recording some outstanding individual and team results. It was a shame that Nationals had to be cancelled due to the lack of snow as 13 of our 19 students qualified and would have competed.

Although the quality of the skiing on offer has not been what we had hoped for, the classroom has been a bustling space with many excursions and special guests this year.

As well as our three day visit from BioLAB and our excursion to the Snowmaking Factory we were lucky enough to be joined on the eve of Interschools by Hannes Grimus from Grimus Ski Center. Hannes was an elite Jr Skier and now runs the Ski Center and Hotel Pension Grimus when not coaching World Cup athletes in Austria over the Northern Hemisphere winter. Hannes had all the students bring their equipment in and went over proper tuning and waxing techniques. He discussed proper ski selection and boot fitting and how to get your gear race ready for Interschools. As always the group had some fantastic questions and were very hands on through the session.

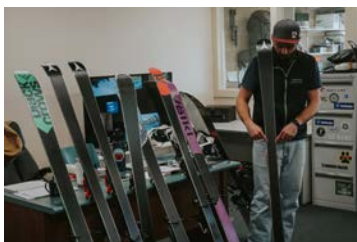
Last week we were lucky enough to be invited to Mt Buller Ski Patrol Base to spend two consecutive afternoons working with the patrollers up there. Our students went through CPR, how to stop bleeding, actions in an emergency, backcountry hazards, most common injuries on the mountain, risk assessment and the pathway to becoming a Ski Patroller. This was an amazing couple of sessions and a relationship we hope to grow into the future.

As with all good things though the term is fast coming to an end. Students will present their final Celebration movies at the Mt Buller Cinema on Wednesday 13th September and that will be it for the year.

I'd like to thank this years group of students who have remained positive in what has been trying conditions at times. They should all be very proud.
