

THUNDERSTORN **ASTHMA SEASON**

Thunderstorm asthma season is between October through to the end of December. People may notice an increase in asthma and hay fever symptoms during this time. This season can also bring on the chance of thunderstorm asthma.

Trunderstorm asthma is thought to be triggered by a unique combination of high amounts of grass pollen in the air and a certain type of thunderstorm. For people who have asthma or hay fever this can trigger severe asthma symptoms.

Who is at risk?

Any student who has a past or current history of hay fever or asthma are at risk of developing nderstorm asthma. It is important to speak to your GP to get further advice on medication and to keep your child's Asthma Management Plan up to date. You can check the Vic Emergency website for the Thunderstorm Asthma forecast https://emergency.vic.gov.au/prepare/#



Mansfield Secondary College is an Asthma Friendly School and staff are trained to administer asthm first aid, All of our excursion first aid kits also contain an emergency asthma reliever and management tool. Please contact our friendly First Aid Team if you wish to discuss your child's health concerns further. At Mansfield Secondary College we have several emergency asthma relievers on site. It is also important that your child carries their personal Ventolin reliever with them while at school and administers any asthma or hay fever medication prior

to arriving at school. If you would like to store your child's hay fever or asthma medication at school, please chat to the team in First Aid to arrange this.
