## **From The Principal**

Dear Parents/Guardians,

### Celebrations:

We like celebrating the success of our young people. Last Friday MSC held the Year 12 Graduation at the Sebel Pinnacle Valley. The occasion is formal, with a sit-down dinner and the presentation of a number of awards. Local Member of Parliament Cindy McLeish attended, as well as representatives from Rotary, the Local Learning and Employment Network (LLEN), and MEGT.

My reflection on the graduation is a strong sense of gratitude at being able to share a part of the lives of this group of young people. There were some outstanding stories of success during their schooling, their journey together and supporting each other, and a real sense of hope for the future. They are an aspirational group, and their work ethic will stand them in good stead for the future.

The Year 10 Celebration Assembly was held on Friday 17th November. This assembly was an opportunity for us to recognise the progress of students throughout their schooling. ### Transitions:
